## **GENERAL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

**For all Human Kinetics scholarships, awards, and prizes there are General and Specific criteria.**

**Students must meet all of the following General Criteria to be eligible for Human Kinetics Scholarships, Awards, and Prizes.**

1. **Completed 27 credits** during the 2008-09 winter session (September to April). Under exceptional circumstances, such as a demonstrated commitment to Varsity athletics or high performance sport, illness, or exceptional personal hardship, full time students who take less than 27 credits **MAY** be considered by the selection committee if, in their personal letter which accompanies the application, they provide a strong supported rationale for taking less than the required 27 credits.
2. **Achieved** at least 75% overall during the 2008-2009 academic year.
3. **Take 24** credits in the School of Human Kinetics during the **2009-2010 winter session** to be eligible to receive any **SCHOLARSHIP** (this requirement does not apply to awards or prizes).

**NOTE 1. Eligibility for scholarships, awards and prizes is based solely on credits taken from September 2008 through April 2009 winter session.**

## **SELECTION AND NOTIFICATION PROCESS**

The selection committee, comprised of the School's Undergraduate Committee, will meet to evaluate applications during the first week of June. Recommendations from the School's Selection Committee will be forwarded to the Department of Awards and Financial Aid which will notify successful students once they have made their decision. Results are not usually made available to students until some time in August. (Please note that the School of Human Kinetics cannot release the names of winners).

Presentation of all awards shall take place at the School of Human Kinetics Awards Night in November 2009.

## HOW TO APPLY

**STEP 1: Read the detailed descriptions and specific eligibility criteria for all Scholarships, Awards, and Prizes (pages 4-7) to determine your eligibility. Only one application form needs to be submitted regardless of the number of rewards you are applying for.**

**STEP 2: Complete the application form on Page 9 including the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act at the bottom of Page 9 (3 copies).**

**STEP 3: Include the following documents with your application**

i) A detailed resume outlining education, employment, volunteer activities, contribution to the School of Human Kinetics, the University and the community **(3 copies)**;

ii) A personal statement describing proposed course of study, professional goals, special interests **(3 copies)**.

Note: Students applying for the ***Human Kinetics Faculty Scholarships, Physical Education Alumni Endowment Fund Scholarships, and the Robert F. Osborne Memorial Award*** should ensure that the following information is contained in the personal statement.

- evidence of active contribution to the School of Human Kinetics through involvement in organizations such as the Human Kinetics Undergraduate Society;

- evidence of active contribution to the University through involvement in campus affairs such as extramural athletic team membership and/or organization; intramural participation and/or organization; student administration in the Alma Mater Society or related organizations;

- evidence of active contribution to the community-at-large through current and/or previous involvement in community affairs such as Sport BC, Red Cross or similar service organizations

- evidence of active involvement in activities related to a future professional career in physical education and/or recreation.

iii) 2 CURRENT confidential letters of reference which confirm and describe your involvement in the activities outlined in your personal statement. (Only 1 copy of each reference letter is required). These reference letters should be addressed to the School of Human Kinetics Scholarship & Awards Selection Committee, and may be sent by email directly from the person writing the reference letter to [dgromer@interchange.ubc.ca](mailto:dgromer@interchange.ubc.ca).

iv) **A copy of your Sessional Grade Report** for all sessions printed from the SSC. **(1 copy)**

## **SCHOLARSHIPS**

### **DESCRIPTIONS AND SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

**NOTE:** ONLY STUDENTS WHO RETURN TO THE SCHOOL OF HUMAN KINETICS IN A FULL-TIME (24 credit minimum) UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM FOR THE 2009-2010 ACADEMIC YEAR ARE ELIGIBLE FOR SCHOOL OF HUMAN KINETICS SCHOLARSHIPS.

#### **PHYSICAL EDUCATION ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIPS**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 1, 2 or 3, in the 2008 Winter Session.*

Scholarships totaling \$5,800 have been endowed by alumni of the School. The Scholarships are made on the recommendation of the School of Human Kinetics to undergraduate students in the BHK program who have displayed academic achievement, leadership, and competency in their field of specialization.

#### **HUMAN KINETICS FACULTY SCHOLARSHIPS**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 1, 2 or 3, in the 2008 Winter Session.*

One or more scholarships totaling \$4,000 have been endowed by donations from the School of Human Kinetics faculty, past and present. The scholarships are awarded on the recommendation of the School to undergraduate students in the BHK program who have displayed academic achievement, leadership, or competency in their field of specialization.

Monies in the Alumni Endowment Fund and the Faculty Endowment Fund are acquired through annual gifts commencing from 1987, from graduate of the School and from current and past faculty members of the School respectively. The accounts are invested in perpetuity through the director of Awards and Financial Aid in the UBC Department of Finance. Interest accrued from investment of the Endowment Funds provides the financial basis for award of these annual scholarships.

#### **MARY ISDALE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 3 in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A \$700 scholarship is offered annually to a student who achieves high academic standing in the Third Year of any field of study. Consideration will be given to eligible students, who over a period of years, have demonstrated particular interest in highland dancing, Scottish Country dancing, piping, or drumming. The award is made on the recommendation of the School of Human Kinetics.

#### **HEATHER LAWSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in year 3 of the Leisure and Sport Management program or Year 3 of the Interdisciplinary Studies Program in the 2008 Winter Session.*

As a memorial to Heather Lawson, a Third Year student in the School of Physical Education and Recreation who was tragically killed in a skiing accident March 1972, her parents, Mr. & Mrs. D.J. Lawson of Victoria, have established a scholarship in the amount of \$1,100. It will be awarded annually to a student, preferably a woman, enrolled in the Bachelor of Human Kinetics degree program, with a specialization in Leisure and Sport Management, or the Interdisciplinary Program who is proceeding to the Fourth Year of the program. The scholarship will be made on the recommendation of the School. The basis of the award is sound academic standing and all round qualities of leadership.

## **SCHOLARSHIPS**

### **WILLIAM B. McNULTY HUMAN KINETICS SCHOLARSHIPS**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Years 1, 2, or 3, in the 2008 Winter Session.*

Two scholarships of \$500 each, a gift of William B. McNulty, B.P.E. '68, will be awarded annually to a male and female student enrolled in the Bachelor of Human Kinetics program in First, Second or Third Year. The awards will be made to students who have been able to combine academic excellence with an outstanding contribution in student or community affairs. Emphasis will be put upon "service above self." The awards will be made on the recommendation of the School of Human Kinetics in consultation with William B. McNulty.

### **ANNE D. TILLEY SCHOLARSHIP IN HUMAN KINETICS**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 3 in the 2008 Winter Session, who will be entering 4<sup>th</sup> year in September 2009.*

A \$900 scholarship has been endowed by Ms. Anne D. Tilley for a fourth year undergraduate student in Human Kinetics who is conducting supervised independent research in the field of developmental disability/mental handicap, with a preference for students working in the social science area. The award is made on the recommendation of the School of Human Kinetics.

### **JANIE AND HECTOR WRIGHT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Years 1, 2, or 3, in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A \$1,300 scholarship has been endowed by Janie D. Bodner (Wright) B.P.E. '56, in memory of her parents. The award is offered to an undergraduate student in Human Kinetics and is made on the recommendation of the School.

### **CAPTAIN C.Y. WU SCHOLARSHIP IN HUMAN KINETICS**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 2 or 3 in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A \$1,450 scholarship is offered by Captain C.Y. Wu and Dr. C.H. Wu, to a Second or Third Year student in the B.H.K. degree program who has demonstrated an interest in aquatic coaching or management. Preference is given to a student with a background in aquatics. The award is made on the recommendation of the School of Human Kinetics.

## AWARDS AND PRIZES

### DESCRIPTIONS AND SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

#### **ROBERT F. OSBORNE MEMORIAL AWARD IN HUMAN KINETICS**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 3 in all programs.*

A \$5,900 award has been endowed in memory of Dr. Robert F. Osborne's outstanding service as coach, teacher and administrator during his 33 years as a faculty member at UBC, 27 of them as Director of the School of Physical Education and Recreation. The award is available to undergraduate students registered in year 3 of the Bachelor of Human Kinetics degree in the 2008 Winter session who have exhibited excellence in academics, athletics, and service in sport and recreation. The award is made on the recommendation of the School of Human Kinetics.

#### **W. GORDON BRANDRETH PRIZE IN HUMAN KINETICS**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 4, of the Health and Fitness Program or year 3 or 4 of the Kinesiology and Health Science Program in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A \$600 prize has been endowed by Mrs. Bertha Brandreth in memory of her husband W. Gordon Brandreth. The prize is offered to a student whose is pursuing studies in Health and Fitness in the School of Human Kinetics, and is made on the recommendation of the School.

#### **LIEUTENANT JAMES DOUGLAS HAMILTON PRIZE**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 3 of the Physical Education program in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A book prize of \$500 in memory of Lieutenant James Douglas Hamilton, a graduate in Physical Education and former member of the C.O.T.C. of this University, who, on April 13, 1952 was killed in action in Korea, is offered by the Human Kinetics Alumni and Undergraduate Societies. The award is open to Third Year students in Physical Education showing academic and physical proficiency in the program.

#### **HUMAN KINETICS UNDERGRADUATE SOCIETY PRIZE**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Years 3 or 4 in the 2008 Winter Session.*

These prizes have been initiated by members of the Human Kinetics Undergraduate Society and are intended to recognize students who have made unselfish contributions to student and faculty life. These prizes in the amount of \$250 will be awarded annually to students in Third or Fourth Year Human Kinetics, who have maintained a high overall academic average and have demonstrated leadership qualities through extra-curricular activities within the field of Human Kinetics. Reference letters by professionals in the field should support the application. The awards will be made on the recommendation of the School of Human Kinetics in consultation with the Human Kinetics Undergraduate Society.

#### **J.J. McRAE MEMORIAL PRIZE**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 3, in the Physical Education program in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A prize of \$600, established by Mrs. R.F. Osborne in memory of her father, J.J. McRae, is awarded to a student in Third Year of the Physical Education option of the B.H.K. degree program with general academic proficiency who has made a contribution to youth work. Special consideration is given to a student who has worked with the blind or other handicapped groups.

## **AWARDS AND PRIZES**

### **PETER ANDREW MARRON MEMORIAL AWARD**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Years 4 of the Exercise Science Program or year 3 or 4 of the Kinesiology and Health Science program in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A \$1,000 award has been endowed in memory of Peter Andrew Marron by his father George A. Marron. The Award is available to a student in the School of Human Kinetics who is pursuing studies in the Exercise Science or Kinesiology and Health Science Programs, or involved in research work who displays scholarship, leadership and perseverance. Preference will be given to a student working in the Buchanan Lab or comparable program. The award is made on the recommendation of the School of Human Kinetics.

### **LEONARD OSBORNE MEMORIAL PRIZE**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 3 of the Physical Education program in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A prize of \$600, in recognition of Robert F. Osborne's long and dedicated service to Physical Education, is awarded to a student in Second or Third Year in the B.H.K. program with general academic proficiency, who has demonstrated expertise and leadership in the field of coaching.

### **R. F. OSBORNE PRIZE**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Years 3, or 4 of the Physical Education program in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A prize of \$500, in recognition of Robert F. Osborne's long and dedicated service to Physical Education, is awarded to a student in the B.H.K. program, with general academic proficiency, leadership and service in the field of Human Kinetics (Physical Education Program).

### **BARBARA SCHRODT AWARD IN HUMAN KINETICS**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Years 3, or 4 of the Physical Education Program.*

A \$1,100 award has been endowed by Barbara Schrodt for an undergraduate student entering or registered in the third or fourth year in the School of Human Kinetics, with preference for a student who has been an outstanding playing member of a women's field hockey team at UBC and is taking courses related to teaching physical and health education. If, in any year, there is no student who fulfills the preferred criteria, the award is given to a student who is an outstanding playing member on any women's athletics team. The award is made on the recommendation of the School in consultation with the Intercollegiate Coordinator, Department of Athletics.

### **JOHN B. SERVICE MEMORIAL PRIZE IN HUMAN KINETICS**

*Year and Program Eligibility: Open to all School of Human Kinetics students registered in Year 4, of the Health and Fitness Program or year 3 or 4 of the Kinesiology and Health Science program, with a focus on Health and Fitness, in the 2008 Winter Session.*

A \$550 prize has been endowed by family and friends in memory of John B. Service. The award is offered to a student specializing in Health and Fitness and made on the recommendation of the School of Human Kinetics.
